UPDATE:

114 Unique clients served in 2024 an decrease from **123** in 2023.

77 active participants enrolled in services at the end of 2024 with a peak of **90** clients in June.

STANDING REPORTS:

Changes in Staffing – Open one BHS position otherwise fully staffed team.

Number of Admissions – **21**

Number of Discharges – **40**

Program Monitoring and Fidelity Compliance –
Next fidelity in 2025

Program Issues & Concerns – Not meeting SEE objectives and not meeting COD objectives and care due to staff availability.

Strengths:

- Providing CBT for psychosis
- Increased program graduation and completion
- Decrease treatment abandonment.
- Increased service area to include “upper valley” (Tampico, Ahtanum and Tieton)
- Increase number of employed clients
- Increased number of clients enrolling in education programs
- Increased Peer Support options to include WRAP group
- IMR group
- COD recovery support group
- PACT family support group

Challenges/obstacles: BHS position vacant for over 1 year. No current SEE specialist on team. COD specialist out on medical leave for extended period of time. One Nurse out on extended FMLA.

Grievances/Complaints: none

Community Outreach & Education:

- Weekly collaboration with Camp Hope in Yakima.
- We are getting direct referrals for intake from Probation, Community resource partners, and web outreach from other cities looking for their clients to transfer. Walk ins as well.
- Collaboration and treatment coordination with other PACT teams within WA state
- Team MHP completing PACT intake and assessment for direct enrollment which has improved referral to enrollment time to less than 48 hrs.
- PACT fidelity monitoring now includes yearly participation in provider symposium sponsored by Univ. of Wa.
