- Providing CBT for psychosis
- Providing CPT (Cognitive Processing Therapy) for Trauma
- Increased program graduation and completion
- Decrease treatment abandonment.
- Increased service area to include “upper valley” (Tampico, Ahtanum and Tieton)
- Increase number of employed clients
- Increased number of clients enrolling in education programs
- WRAP Group
- IMR group
- COD recovery support group (adjusted to psychoEd group)
- PACT family support group
- *Staff being trained in CBT for Psychosis Group and will implement in summer 2026

Challenges/obstacles: COD position vacant. Case manager position open. Staff out on FMLA

Community Outreach & Education:

- Weekly collaboration with Camp Hope in Yakima.
- We are getting direct referrals for intake from Probation, Community resource partners, and web outreach from other cities looking for their clients to transfer. Walk ins as well.
- Collaboration and treatment coordination with other PACT teams within WA state
- Team MHP completing PACT intake and assessment for direct enrollment which has improved referral to enrollment time to less than 48 hrs.
- PACT fidelity monitoring now includes yearly participation in provider symposium sponsored by Univ. of Wa.
